The latest update as of 4 pm this afternoon

The City of Richwood has opened all streets and neighborhoods to vehicle traffic. There is still some standing water on various streets, but it is passable by vehicle. We are seeing the water slowly recede, however the water may remain for several days. Our ditches and retention areas will remain filled with water as well for several days and possibly several weeks. We are asking everyone to walk around their property and empty any container or item that may have standing water inside it. The City is preparing to begin spraying for mosquitos early next week. We are in the process of setting up a schedule to begin cleaning up the streets and having a street sweeper in the areas that were flooded next week.

Richwood has established a drop off point for anyone who does not want their sandbags. You can bring the sandbags to the parking lot adjacent to the community center, by the baseball field. There will be a coned off area where you can place the sandbags.

We want to remind everyone that the City of Richwood has contacted the Post Office and the mail which could not to be delivered due to the flooded streets around the mail boxes, will be delivered as soon as the mail carriers can access the mail boxes. If you are in need of your mail sooner, you can go by the Lake Jackson Post Office and obtain your mail.

The City of Richwood would like to express its sincere thanks to our community for the outpouring support shown to the city and to our community during this event. This will conclude our messages regarding the flooding event unless conditions warrant otherwise.
