Not only did we realize impressive reductions in reported serious crime offenses, but the city also saw excellence in work performance from the officers of the department. 


The year 2023 realized reductions in three (3) of the seven (7) serious crime categories. Homicides remained unchanged at zero, as did robberies. Motor Vehicle Theft increased by one to seven (7). Burglaries (Building/Habitation) also saw an increase of two cases from last year. In 2022, three (3) burglaries were reported whereas in 2023, reported burglaries were counted at five (5). Aggravated Assault cases showed a significant reduction of 100%. The year 2022 realized 3 Aggravated Assaults while 2023 saw zero. Sexual Assaults also fell by 60% as there were five (5) reported in 2022 and two (2) reported in 2023. Finally, Larceny/Thefts realized a 13% reduction. Reported cases dropped from forty-five (45) to thirty-nine (39) when comparing 2022 to 2023.

<u>CRASHES</u>

The year 2023 realized a total number of motor vehicle crashes as sixty-one (61). This is an increase of three (3) crashes as compared to the year 2022. Even so, crashes on FM 2004 were reduced by seven (7) and SH 288B saw a decrease of five (5) crashes. Crashes in the residential areas increased by three (3) in 2023 as compared to 2022.

<u>Richwood police officers:</u>

- interacted with 4,521 motor vehicle operators during traffic contacts, a **15% increase** when compared to the 3,935 traffic contacts made in the year 2022.
- investigated and arrested four (4) suspected Driving While Intoxicated offense.
- performed 80 motorist assists.

CALLS FOR SERVICE

The Richwood Police Department answered a total of 2,154 calls for service in 2023. This is a 6% reduction when compared to the 2288 calls for service answered in 2022.


The #1 call for service in the year 2022 was <u>ANIMAL COMPLAINTS</u>. In 2023, animal complaints continued to be the #1 call for service in Richwood, but the total number of calls dropped by 57, down to 257 from 314.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT calls were the second highest call type in 2022 and that didn't change in 2023. However, the number of calls for Disorderly Conduct also lessened from 258 in 2022 to 236 in 2023.
